- Attend weekly team meetings and initiate one-on-one meetings with supervisor
- Provide general research support
- Assist with data analysis and other relevant projects
- Create content for the program to for targeted audiences
- Present information to current students and/or external community members
- Coordinate with financial literacy interns, graduate assistants, and supervisor for seamless project development and management
- Collaborate with internal groups, departments and/or external organizations to organize financial literacy opportunities and facilitate financial literacy related workshops
- Other duties as assigned
